Move to bring Draupadi's Kampilya on tourist map

The Uttar Pradesh Tourism department is collaborating with the Draupadi Dream Trust to bring her home town Kampilya in the tourism map of the state.

Neera Misra, a resident of that area who has been doing extensive research on Draupadi for the past several years, says that they have already sent a proposal to the UP Tourism Department for the formation of Kampilya-Sankisa Heritage Development Board for its development.

A senior official in the Tourism department told 'The Pioneer' that the proposal had been sent to various government departments for NOC (no objection certificate).

"After receiving the NOC from the various departments, the proposal will be sent for the approval of the state Cabinet," he added. Misra, who mooted the project, said it was necessary to highlight Draupadi as she was the first iconic woman who spoke against the prevalent traditions and was a great

Stop call or face warns of

TRAI to review telecom firms services after 15 days

Talking tough, the Government on Wednesday asked mobile operators to take urgent steps to check the unabated call drops. If the situation does not improve soon, the Centre warned, the Telecom Regulatory Authority (TRA) said the performance of telecom companies will be reviewed after 15 days. It warned them of action if they fail to improve their services.

"Presently, I am not imposing any kind of action, but I do have the option if the situation doesn't improve," the Minister told the Parliament on Wednesday. He said the Government had
